UNSC

“Maintaining regional stability and upholding international law amid the South China Sea Dispute”

The **United Nations Security Council** is the most powerful organ of the United Nations system, bearing primary responsibility for the maintenance of international peace and security. Comprising five permanent members with veto authority and ten elected non-permanent members, the UNSC holds the unique capacity to adopt binding resolutions, authorize the use of force, impose sanctions, and establish peacekeeping operations. It remains the singular multilateral body where the competing interests of the world's major powers converge in response to the most urgent threats to global stability.

The South China Sea remains one of the most significant geopolitical flashpoints of the 21st century. Rich in natural resources and home to some of the world's busiest maritime trade routes, the region is claimed in part or in whole by multiple nations, resulting in overlapping territorial claims, heightened military activity, and growing diplomatic tensions.

As delegates of the Security Council, participants will be tasked with navigating competing national interests, interpreting international law, and exploring diplomatic solutions to prevent escalation. This agenda challenges delegates to balance sovereignty, security, economic interests, and regional stability while addressing a dispute that continues to test the effectiveness of international cooperation and global governance.



DISEC

“Analyzing the financial backing of Non-State Actors, with a specific focus on the Middle East, the Red Sea, and the Horn of Africa”

The **Disarmament and International Security Committee** is one of the United Nations' foremost bodies tasked with addressing the evolving relationship between technological advancement and global security. DISEC engages with questions of arms regulation, conflict prevention, and the development of international norms governing the use of force, serving as a critical forum where member states negotiate frameworks that balance sovereign security interests with the principles of international humanitarian law.

The proliferation of Non-State Actors (NSAs) in the Middle East, the Red Sea, and the Horn of Africa is sustained by a complex web of state sponsorship, illicit trade, and informal financial networks. Disrupting these decentralized funding mechanisms requires a multilateral approach to cut off financial flows.



CCC

“Dismantling the Red Corridor”

Continuous Crisis Committee (CCC). Step into a fast-paced world where every decision shapes history. The Continuous Crisis Committee (CCC) challenges delegates to think on their feet, respond to unfolding events, and navigate complex political, military, and diplomatic crises in real time. Unlike traditional MUN committees, CCC offers dynamic debates, strategic decision-making, and unexpected twists that test leadership, creativity, and adaptability.

Set in the aftermath of the Dantewada attack of 6 April 2010, this Crisis Committee (CCC) will address the growing Maoist insurgency across India's Red Corridor. Delegates will navigate the complex challenges of internal security, counterinsurgency operations, governance, tribal rights, and economic development while responding to dynamic crisis updates. As key decision-makers, participants must balance military, political, and humanitarian considerations to curb the insurgency and determine the future course of one of India's most significant internal security conflicts.



SPECPOL

“Discussing exploitation in non-self-governing and disputed territories by various actors”

The **Special Political and Decolonization Committee (SPECPOL)** is one of the principal committees of the United Nations General Assembly. It addresses a diverse range of international political issues, including decolonization, peacekeeping operations, refugee concerns, human rights, and global security challenges. Through debate, negotiation, and resolution drafting, delegates work collaboratively to propose solutions to complex global problems while developing their diplomatic, research, and public speaking skills.

This agenda focuses on the exploitation of resources, populations, and strategic locations within non-self-governing and disputed territories. It examines how various actors—including states, corporations, and non-state groups—may influence or benefit from political instability, often raising concerns related to sovereignty, human rights violations, environmental degradation, and unequal economic practice. Delegates will be expected to analyze the historical and legal context of such territories under international frameworks, particularly the United Nations Charter and relevant resolutions on decolonization and territorial integrity. The discussion will also address the impact of extractive industries, militarization, and external interventions on local populations.



AIPPM

“Deliberation on the balance between National Security and Personal Liberty under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) with special emphasis on prolonged pre-trial detention”

The **All India Political Parties Meet (AIPPM)** is a non-conventional forum that replicates the consensus-building process of real-world Indian politics. Bringing together representatives from across the national political spectrum, it addresses critical questions of governance, constitutional validity, national security, and socio-economic policy. Through intense debate, strategic negotiations, and the drafting of joint communiqués, delegates simulate the complexities of Indian legislative and executive decision-making while honing their skills in political strategy, policy analysis, and public diplomacy

This agenda dives into the high-stakes clash between the state's iron fist and the fundamental right to freedom. It tackles the controversial Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA)—a law where the line between national defense and the silencing of dissent is fiercely contested. Delegates will cross swords over the constitutional battleground of Article 21, dissecting how stringent bail laws and weaponized investigative powers can turn prolonged pre-trial detention into a form of de facto punishment. By analyzing high-profile cases of jailed activists and dissidents, the committee must confront a burning democratic dilemma: at what point does protecting the nation begin to destroy the very liberties it is meant to safeguard?
